

What is ABA? How do we get it?

ABA is a set of scientific principles that form the basis of treatments for behavior problems and learning.

ABA applies evidence based interventions to increase useful and desirable behaviors, and to decrease behaviors that interfere with learning or the individual's ability to interact with their natural environment.

ABA is considered the "gold standard" of treatment for individuals with autism.

Qualifying Diagnosis Obtain a comprehensive diagnostic evaluation – for most funding sources: Autism.

Funding

Determine insurance coverage for ABA. Apply for LISS supplemental funding

Find a Provider Find a provider with availability for new clients in your area. Ask your insurance company for list of providers, look online, ask other parents.

Assessment

Your provider will assign a BCBA who will conduct an assessment to determine problem behaviors and skill levels.

Parent Training Parent training can begin after the assessment, and your BCBA will give recommendations to decrease problem bx. and increase skills.

In Home Services A 1:1 technician will be identified (if recommended) and your BCBA provides continual training, supervision and program development.

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
